2: Academic Integrity

Students' Rights and Responsibilities

Each student is expected to maintain the highest standards of honesty and integrity in academic and professional matters. Academic dishonesty includes, but is not limited to, dishonesty in quizzes, tests, or assignments; claiming credit for work not done or done by others; hindering the academic work of other students; misrepresenting academic or professional qualifications within or without the University; and nondisclosure or misrepresentation in filling out applications or other University records.

Plagiarism. Plagiarism is taking credit for someone else's work whether deliberately or unintentionally. This includes but is not limited to turning in all or part of an essay written by someone other than yourself (a friend, an Internet source, etc.) and claiming it as your own, and including information or ideas from research material without citing the source.

Forms of plagiarism include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Use of direct quotations without the use of quotation marks and referencing of the source of the quotation.
- Incorrect paraphrasing information without proper citation of the source.
- Failure to provide adequate citations for material used.
- The purchase of a scholarly paper or any other academic product from the Internet or any other commercial sources and submitting it as your own work.
- Downloading work from the Internet and submitting it without citation.
- Directly copying and pasting from any source, electronic or written, into any academic assignment without explicit citation of the original source.
- Submission of a work product from a previous course for credit in a current course without direct permission of the instructor.

By using your Net ID and unique password to access the Blackboard Learn Learning Management System, you are affirming that you are the person registered for the course, the person doing the work for the course, and the person getting the credit for the course. It is a violation of the academic honesty and intellectual integrity policies to log in to someone else's account and impersonate that person.

Faculty Rights and Responsibilities

The University reserves the right to take disciplinary action, up to and including dismissal, against any student who is found guilty of academic dishonesty or who otherwise fails to meet the expected standards. Any student judged to have engaged in academic dishonesty in course work may receive a reduced or failing grade for the work in question and/or for the course.

Include the following language in your syllabus and make sure that your students are aware of the policy around Academic Integrity. For an online course, it is recommended that you have an assessment tool connected to the syllabus the first week of class. This could be a quiz, scavenger hunt, discussion or whatever else you choose to use to assess that they have looked over and read your course materials including the syllabus.
