

- **Job Placement** (Program graduates get great-paying, full-time jobs in natural resources management.)
- **Very Affordable** (Full-time tuition/semester for NM Residents = \$951; Non-residents = \$2,391)

Program Overview

Students in the Natural Resources Program are prepared for a career in natural resource management.

- **Education:** Students earn Associate Degrees of Pre-Science at UNM-Taos and transfer to New Mexico Highlands University in Las Vegas, NM, to complete a Bachelor of Science in Forestry, Biology, or Geology or a Bachelor of Arts in Conservation Management.
- **Experience:** Many students do internships with government agencies, like the US Forest Service, and nongovernmental organizations that conserve and protect resources such as NM Wildlife Federation.
- **Jobs:** Experience and education are a winning combination that gets graduates good-paying jobs!

UNM-Taos currently has a grant from the U.S. Department of Agriculture to support students in the Northern New Mexico Climate Change Corps (The CCC). Housed within the Natural Resources Program, CCC students receive generous stipends, paid internships, academic support, and knowledge about climate change. 1. Apply

2. Advising

Meet with an academic advisor to learn about prerequisites, transfer credits, and to develop a plan of study. To make an appointment with an advisor, call Student Services (575-737-6215) or stop by Padre Martinez Hall at the Klauer campus. If you have college credit outside of UNM, you will need to provide official transcripts.

3. Math Placement

After you meet with an advisor, you will know if you need to take a math placement test called Accuplacer, administered in CASA (Center for Academic Success and Achievement) at the Klauer Campus (575-737-3695, <http://taos.unm.edu/home/casa/>).

If you do need to take this test, ask for a Math Refresher Packet at the CASA front desk or contact naturalresources@unm.edu. Use the Math Refresher Packet to study before taking the math placement test. The higher you place, the fewer math courses you will need to take.

If you have applied, then you can use the UNM-Taos math tutors available at CASA to help you study for the Accuplacer.

4. Financial Aid
